## NORTH CENTRAL LOCAL GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION (NCLGA) A SNAPSHOT OF THE 2011 AGM

### City of Terrace and the Regional District of Kitimat - Stikine Resolution is Endorsed by NCLGA members



With the steadily declining funding through Heritage BC, the City and the Regional District felt compelled to move this resolution forward to highlight the importance of heritage resources as an intrinsic component of BC culture, essential for cultural and economic development. Our resolution resolved that NCLGA and Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) lobby the Provincial Government to renew its commitment to heritage conservation. The main thrust of the Resolution was to recommend that the Province restore community support for Local Governments and community heritage organizations such as Heritage BC.

### Friends of Wild Salmon Host Public Reception for NCLGA - Oil: Our Communities, Our Choices

During the NCLGA conference, the Friends of Wild Salmon hosted a very informative public reception that built on information already available regarding the Enbridge Northern Gateway Pipelines project. A particularly moving presentation was given by Marven Robinson, an Ecotourism Guide and Gitga'at Councillor. Marven lives in Hartley Bay, a community in the heart of the Great Bear Rainforest, where Gitga'at people and culture have lived and thrived for millennia. Also speaking at the event were Andrew Nikiforuk, author and journalist, and Art Sterritt, Coastal First Nations/Great Bear Initiative.

### Northwest Powerline Coalition Sponsors NCLGA Welcome Reception

The Northwest Powerline Coalition was one of many corporate sponsors at this year's NCLGA conference. We were proud to sponsor the Welcome Reception at the historic North Pacific Cannery in Port Edward. 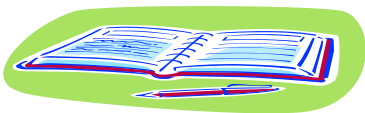


### TERRACE IN MOTION

**Terrace City Council passed the following resolutions during our two sessions in May on the 9th and 24th. (Complete City Council meeting minutes are available at [www.terrace.ca](http://www.terrace.ca))**

- The request for a letter of support for the Coast Tsimshian Resources for their application for a Tech Green Award was defeated
- That the May 9th Committee of the Whole verbal report be adopted with the following recommendations:
  1. A development permit be issued to McDonald's Restaurant for renovations on the exterior and interior of the commercial property
  2. A development permit be issued to the Provincial Rental Housing Corporation for exterior improvements for a multi-family development
- The request for Mayor Pernarowski or another Council member to travel to the Rural Emergency Continuum of Care Conference in Kelowna for an estimated cost of \$1,423.80 to come from Council's Unallocated Travel Budget was defeated
- That the minutes of the Seniors Committee be received and the recommendation contained within regarding increasing the visibility of the wooded area behind the Willows extending to Olson Avenue be referred to Administration
- That the Financial Plan Bylaw be read by title only and adopted
- That the Tax Rate Bylaw be read by title only and adopted
- That the City send well wishes to Rita Chretien
- That the verbal presentation from President Denise Henning of the Northwest Community College be received for information
- That the verbal presentation from Evan van Dyk, Economic Development Officer, Terrace Economic Development Authority and Chair Rob Dykman be received for information
- That the request the City of Terrace donate \$10,000.00 to the Canadian Cancer Society for the Kordyban Lodge be referred to Administration
- That the May 24th Committee of the Whole verbal report be adopted with the following recommendations:
  1. That the Bylaw to permanently close and remove the Highway dedication for a 6.5 square metre area of land proceed to Council for adoption
  2. That a Bylaw to establish a Business Improvement Area in downtown Terrace proceed to Council for First, Second, and Third readings
  3. It was recommended that the City of Terrace write a letter to the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure requesting an independent review of the BC Transit governance model and funding relationship with Local Government, and that Local Governments be invited to participate in this review
- That the Terrace Regional Transit 2011/2012 Annual Operating Agreement be approved
- That Councillor Carol Leclerc be appointed to represent the City of Terrace, and vote on the City's behalf at the Northwest Airport Society 2011 Annual General Meeting
