The Northwest Transmission Line (NTL) project is currently in the public consultation portion of the BC environmental assessment review through the BC Environmental Assessment Office (EAO).

The City of Terrace fully supports the project and I would encourage everyone to comment to the EAO.

The NTL project will open the door to economic prosperity in our region and holds tremendous po-

tential for people across the northwest.

The resulting access to electricity would stimulate economic activities for our area and would encourage a more diverse regional economy.

TERRACE IN MOTION

At the May 10 Council meeting there were a number of presentations to individuals and groups to recognize their contributions to our community. The Greater Terrace Beautification Society gave out awards for their cleanest school yard contest. The Caetano family was recognized for their actions reporting a house fire in January 2009. Jane Dickson, recipient of a BC Community Achievement Award, was presented with a certificate of appreciation for her volunteer work in Terrace. Also at the May 10 meeting Council approved a \$2,500 grant to Music and Friends Society for their annual



festival and Council approved donating \$39,000 to Northwest Community College for their Emergency Services Training Centre project. Council adopted the 2010—2014 Financial Plan as a bylaw and also the 2010 Tax Rate Bylaw at this meeting.

At the May 25 council meeting Council received a presentation from Canada Post. Council resolved to co-host an open forum with the Kitimat-Terrace & District Labour Council regarding the Enbridge Northern Gateway Pipeline project.

Carol enjoys the beauty of the Terrace area

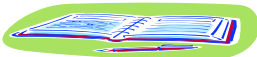
and feels quite fortunate to live here. She believes Terrace is continuing to grow into a diversified city by being the centre for the Northwest for retail, medical, education, and transportation.
