



## Wood Stove Exchange Program – City of Terrace

**2010**

Due to the success of our 2009 City of Terrace Wood Stove Exchange Program we are carrying over the project into 2010. From January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010 until December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2010, the City of Terrace is offering 10 rebates of \$100 each, in addition to the \$250 provincial rebate\*. We will also waive the building permit fee (approximately \$50) for any homeowners participating in the program.

\*Please note that provincial program rebates are going quickly.

### Background

The provincial wood stove exchange program is designed to encourage British Columbians to change out their older smoky wood stoves for new CSA/EPA-certified clean burning, low emission wood or pellet stoves. Full details explaining how the provincial program works can be found [here](#).

### Key objectives of the program include:

- Raising community awareness of the importance of efficient, safe, smoke-free wood burning
- Encouraging wood burners to take action to improve their ability to burn wood smoke-free, efficiently and safely by offering information and financial incentives for positive change
- Encouraging more homeowners in the City of Terrace to choose wood or pellets as a source of heat

### Participation Details

1. Make the choice to invest in a new, clean burning efficient stove and pick out a new, EPA certified wood or pellet stove from one of the participating retailers. The retailer will take care of the details of the provincial program.
2. Visit the City of Terrace Public Works (5003 Graham Ave.) to obtain an application form and building permit (at no cost).
3. Recycle your old wood stove by bringing it down to City of Terrace Public Works (5003 Graham Ave.) Stoves will be decommissioned onsite once dropped off.
4. Once stove is received and a final permit inspection is complete applicant will receive a \$100 check in the mail.
