DELEGATIONS & GUESTS:

Casey Eys, Terrace and District Community Services Society – All Nations Centre Update *Mr.* Eys, representing the Terrace and District Community Services Society (TDCSS), thanked Council for the opportunity to present regarding their Homelessness Outreach Program (HOP). Mr. Eys would like to have greater integration between the day centre from which HOP runs, local businesses and Local Government. The HOP started approximately three years ago and is funded by BC Housing. A facility was required to allow the clients indoors during inclement weather. TDCSS moved HOP to a building on Sparks Street, which they rent from the Seventh Day Adventist Church.

The HOP is entirely staffed by volunteers from the community. A number of community agencies contribute to the program, and they are looking for more community participation. The program relies on fundraising events and donations from businesses and individuals.

Mr. Eys described the program as more than a soup kitchen. They have a number of programs running from the centre, including Northern Health Authority outreach services, distribution of donated clothing, medical treatment, tobacco cessation services, counseling services and referrals, and Food Share distribution.

Approximately 80 people per day visit the centre, at a cost of about \$1 per day per person. Mr. Eys emphasized that this very low cost program has delivered tangible results in the community.

Mr. Eys would like Council to view the HOP has an integral part of the community and to support their efforts to pursue Provincial and Federal funding. Mr. Eys would also welcome support from the City through the donations of services in-kind, or tax exemptions once they own their own building.

D. The Benefiting Lands and the proportions of the benefit were determined by the Council as set out in Resolution No. (3) passed on May 24, 2011, with a very slight change in frontage (0.641 metres) due to subdivisions occurring during the course of the works.
