#### **DELEGATIONS & GUESTS:**

Dave Kmet, TransCanada – Expression of Support for Proposed Coastal GasLink and Prince Rupert Gas Transmission Projects Dave Kmet, from TransCanada, Coastal introduced himself. Mr. Kmet requested a letter of support from the City of Terrace regarding the Proposed Coastal GasLink and Prince Rupert Gas Transmission Projects.

To date, TransCanada has logged hundreds of thousands of hours on the ground utilizing local contractors and local workers. They were the first industrial partner in the Northwest Readiness project, and are further investing in the local labour force through Northwest Community College and through TriCorp.

Investors outside of the local community only hear about the media coverage and controversy that surrounds resource projects in the Northwest. Receiving a letter of support directly from the local community goes a long way to aid investors in making their decisions about a project.

Vanderhoof, Houston, Chetwynd, and Burns Lake have provided letters of support for the project.

TransCanada is aware of the Revenue Benefits Alliance (RBA) and encouraged the Provincial Government and the communities to get together and have discussions around the RBA.

Mayor Leclerc thanked Mr. Kmet for his presentation and advised the matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (See Resolution No. 345).

Ross Smith – Arena Sound System Proposed Upgrades Ross Smith introduced himself as the owner of Rosco Ventures and a member of the Terrace River Kings organization.

Mr. Smith explained that the sound quality of the system in the arena has always been an issue and people have difficulty understanding what comes through the speakers.

Scott Wilson of Sight & Sound provided a quote for a new system. The new system will accommodate many ice users' needs (figure skating, ice hockey, etc.).

Mr. Smith has requested that the Council give permission for him to start a fundraising program to raise a portion of the funds for the replacement sound system. He also requested that Council consider contributing towards the costs and include the item in their budget reviews for the upcoming year.

Mayor Leclerc thanked Mr. Smith for his presentation and advised the matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (See Resolution No. 346).

Merv Ritchie – Voter Participation Rates Merv Ritchie introduced himself as a representative of the Land, Air and Water (LAW) Party.

Mr. Ritchie requested that Council campaign Elections BC and Elections Canada to reduce the voting age to 14 for residents. Mr. Ritchie argued that the younger people are when they get involved in politics, the greater the voter turnout.

1. DEVELOPMENT PERMIT NO. 16-2015 - SKEENA VALLEY BAPTIST CHURCH (3306 GRIFFITH STREET)

It is recommended that the City issue Development Permit No. 16-2015 to Skeena Valley Baptist Church for the property legally described as Lot 1, District Lot 1704, Range 5, Coast District, Plan PRP14177 [3306 Griffith Street] for interior building renovations as well as site improvements, to permit use of this former church building as an educational facility with the following variances:

➤ To vary section 11.3.3.3.a of Zoning Bylaw No. 2069-2014 and amendments thereto to reduce the Minimum Setback from a front parcel line from 7.5 metres to 2.58 metres to allow for the construction of an entrance landing to be attached to a front porch on a R2—Semi-Detached Residential zoned property.

# 3. DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT NO. 18-2015 — SILVERTIP PROMOTIONS & SIGNS (5039 KEITH AVENUE)

It is recommended that the City issue Development Variance Permit No. 18-2015 for the property located at 5039 Keith Avenue (Lot 1, District Lot 611, Range 5, Coast District, Plan EPP47003), including the following variances:

- ➤ To vary Schedule C Number, Dimensions and Location of Individual Signs by Zoning District of Signage Bylaw No. 1500 1996 and amendments thereto, to increase the maximum allowable percentage of wall area for signage in the M1 Light Industrial Zone from 5 percent to 10 percent.
- ➤ To vary Schedule C Number, Dimensions and Location of Individual Signs by Zoning District of Signage Bylaw No. 1500 1996 and amendments thereto, to reduce the required setback from the front property line for a freestanding sign from 3.0 meters to 0.9 meters.

## 4. DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT NO. 19-2015 — SILVERTIP (4655 LAZELLE AVENUE)

It is recommended that the City issue Development Variance Permit No. 19-2015 for the property located at 4655 Lazelle A venue (Lot B (Being the Consolidation of Lots 3, 4 and 5, Block 4, District Lot 361, Plan 972 See BA153558) Block 4, District Lot 361, Range 5, Coast District, Plan 972), including the following variances:

➤ To vary Schedule B — Maximum Total Sign Area Per Zone Lot By Zoning District of Signage Bylaw No. 1500 — 1996 and amendments thereto, to increase the maximum percentage of ground floor area of the principal building for total sign area permitted in the C1 — Central Business Commercial Zone from 8 percent to 10 percent.
