DELEGATIONS & GUESTS:

Greg DeMille, Skeena Sawmills, Request for Resolution of Support for the Fibre Utilization Scanning Project *Mr.* DeMille, Woodlands Manager for Skeena Sawmills, presented to Council. He introduced the Internal Defect Detection Project, which is a program that uses a CT scanner to x-ray logs for internal defects prior to milling.

The main species in the forests around Terrace are western hemlock and balsam. Both species have high percentages of internal rot, which can grade them as pulp logs. British Columbia does not have a pulp market and by not using 30% - 50% of the forest profile, it makes lumber production challenging and expensive. Skeena Sawmills will be working with FP Innovations and Microtec. The project will involve scanning logs using a CT X-ray scanner, and using that scan to determine the optimal cuts for each log to maximize the lumber production.

The project will run in three phases. Phase 1 is the log scanning, and will be done in Vancouver at FP Innovations' facility. Phase 2 will look at the data analysis and algorithm refinement. Phase 3 will look at defect detection verification. The estimated budget for the project is \$300,000.

Skeena Sawmills is exploring several funding opportunities for this project, including Industrial Research Assistance Program (IRAP) funding, through the Federal Government, provincial funding through the BC Rural Dividend Program, and regional funding through Northern Development Initiative Trust (NDIT).

Mr. DeMille requested resolutions of support for both the BC Rural Dividend funding application and for the NDIT funding application.

Mayor Leclerc thanked Mr. DeMille for his presentation and advised that the matter would be further dealt with under Correspondence. (See Resolution Nos. 422 and 423).
