Youth Advisory Committee – Youth Priorities for 2017 Zack Bilash, Nisha Nijjar, and Quin Kohlman presented on behalf of the Youth Advisory Committee. Each person spoke to some priorities the Youth Advisory Committee had for 2017.

Mr. Bilash raised concerns over the sidewalks and used Eby (north of Scott Avenue) as an example. Mr. Bilash also discussed his participation in the Vancouver Sun Run and suggested that the City host something similar as there was a lot of participation and running is an activity that is not prohibitively expensive for participants.

Ms. Kohlman raised concerns over the state of the ball fields and the dugouts on the south side of Terrace. With the gates not closing on dugout cages, and the fields being void of grass in some areas there were concerns over safety for players on the fields.

Ms. Nijjar suggested that the City provide more opportunities for outdoor activities. She provided an example of using the soccer fields as a meeting location where people could go and participate in low-cost activities.

Mayor Leclerc thanked the Youth Advisory Committee for their presentation and advised that the matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (See Resolution No. 156).
