NSCU suggested three possible locations for the viewer: Skeenaview Drive, near McConnell Estates, in front of the Terrace Sportsplex overlooking George Little Park, or anywhere along the Millennium Trail, (possibly at the Flywheel).

The viewer is a durable quality and is the same kind of viewer used at Niagara Falls, so it can handle the use and the weather. The only maintenance on the viewer would be periodic cleaning of the glass.

NSCU will pay for the installation of the viewer. They have requested that the decision be confirmed with them by July 31, 2017 to allow for 6-7 weeks for delivery, and to have installation in place before October 19, 2017, which is Credit Union Day. NSCU would like to hold a dedication event on October 19, 2017.
