1. APPLICATION FOR NEW STOREFRONT CANNABIS RETAIL SALES LICENSE – BATH & DHILLON (101-4435 LAKELSE AVENUE)

It was recommended that Council pass the following resolution:

Be it resolved that:

- 1. The City of Terrace Council <u>does not</u> recommend the approval of the license for the following reasons:
 - a) There were several written responses and statements received from adjacent property owners, residents and tenants, including a petition with one-hundred (100) signatures from patrons of the adjacent business and residents of the community;
 - b) The proposed location for this use is not considered to be compatible with adjacent land uses including a mix of higher-density residential developments; and
 - c) The approval of a license for a non-medical cannabis retail store at the subject location may negatively impact the use and enjoyment of the surrounding community.

- 2. A public notice of hearing was sent out to the owners of all properties within 100 metres of the subject property and a notice was placed in the local newspaper. The notices gave the date, time, and location of the public input hearing to give the public an opportunity to voice their opinions. The hearing was held at the Council meeting on August 12, 2019.
 - One (1) written response was received from a member of the public citing concerns regarding the location of the proposed non-medical cannabis retail store in relation to the Ksan damp shelter (Turning Points Housing Connections) and Twin River Estates (Seniors Residential Complex).
 - One (1) written response was also received from the business owner in the adjacent unit of the commercial building citing concerns with compliance to provincial regulations and the nature of the proposed business. Concerns were raised as cannabis sales are directed towards individuals who are 19+, whereas the adjacent business (Comic Encounters) captures a wider audience, including minors.

A review of the revised floor plan as submitted by the applicant confirmed the proposal includes adding a second entrance and private vestibule at the front of building, alleviating concerns regarding a shared vestibule. The applicant will also be required to cover all windows and doors with a non-transparent film to ensure non-medical cannabis, cannabis accessories, and transactions involving those products are not visible from outside the store.

- 3. A second public input hearing was held at the Council meeting on August 26, 2019, as the community of Twin River Estates (3232 Apsley Street) was missed in the original mail out notification. Notices were mailed to the residents of Twin River Estates indicating the date and time of the additional public input hearing.
 - One (1) petition was submitted voicing opposition to approving a non-medical cannabis retail licence at the subject location. The petition included an overall total of 100 signatures and of those, sixty-six (66) individuals indicated they were Terrace residents, thirty-three (33) individuals listed they

were from other municipalities and one (1) individual did not list an address.

In addition to the petition, three (3) members of the public spoke at the hearing, noting concerns regarding:

- the R.C.M.P.'s capacity to handle an increase of intoxicated individuals as a result of cannabis sales;
- the recent increase in crime, violence, and vagrancy in the area;
- the proximity of the cannabis store in relation to residential areas and the extreme weather shelter; and
- the potential negative impact of a non-medical cannabis retail store on local youth (both visiting the adjacent commercial retailers and living in the area).
