  - b) The approval of a license for a non-medical cannabis retail store at the subject location will negatively impact the use and enjoyment of the surrounding community.
  - 2. A public notice of hearing was sent out to the owners of all properties within 100 metres of the subject property and a notice was placed in the local newspaper. The notices gave the date,

time, and location of the public input hearing to give the public an opportunity to voice their opinions. The hearing was held at the Council meeting on January 13th, 2020:

- An adjacent business owner (Bruno Belanger - Gemma's Boutique/4627 Lakelse Avenue) spoke in favor of the application, noting that the applicant has other investments in the community that he maintains at a high standard.
- An adjacent business owner and property owner (Lara Roldo - Fiori Designs/4619 Lakelse Avenue) raised concerns about an additional cannabis shop, given the size of our community. She had concerns regarding impressions on visitors to our community. She elaborated on additional concerns with the application in an email following the Public Input Hearing, including:
  - Concerns that the work various community organizations (TDIA, LOVE Terrace, Greater Terrace Beautification Society) have done to revitalize our downtown will be eroded by additional retail cannabis shop(s).
  - Concerns around the need to black out windows of the storefront.
  - Please see attached letter.
- An adjacent property owner (Dino Stella/4617 Lakelse Avenue) also spoke. He raised concerns about the number of cannabis retails stores and the potential impact on the existing drug problems in our community.

Following the January 13th, 2020 meeting, and prior to staff submitting the materials for the February 10th, 2020 meeting, additional input was received as follows:

> One (1) written response was also received from the business owner of Primerica Financial Services, located on the second floor at 4619 Lakelse Avenue. His submission included concerns around location suitability, undesirable branding of our downtown, and negative implications on other potential investors. Please see attached letter.

- One (1) written response was also received from the business owner of All Star Shoes. She noted concerns around the requirement to cover windows of cannabis retails stores and the impact this would have on trying to create a lively, welcoming downtown. She notes the existing issues with vagrancy and empty storefronts. Please see attached letter.
- One (1) written response and (1) phone call was also received from the owner of Hive Cannabis. He noted his opposition to the application with concerns about proximity to his business. Please see attached letter.

Following the submission of materials for the February 10th, 2020 meeting, but prior to the holding of the meeting, additional input was received as follows:

- A package was submitted by the applicant with a combination of form letters and petition signatures in support of the application. The total number of signatures received between the form letters and petition was 467.
