- 4 greatest challenges:
- Grossly inflated housing market, lack of available housing, unemployment and underemployed, lack of health resources – addictions and mental health
- 4 greatest successes:
- Reuniting families, successful completion of treatment, mental health assessments identified, financial stability through employment and or advocacy securing social assistance and PWD, these improve self-sustainability
