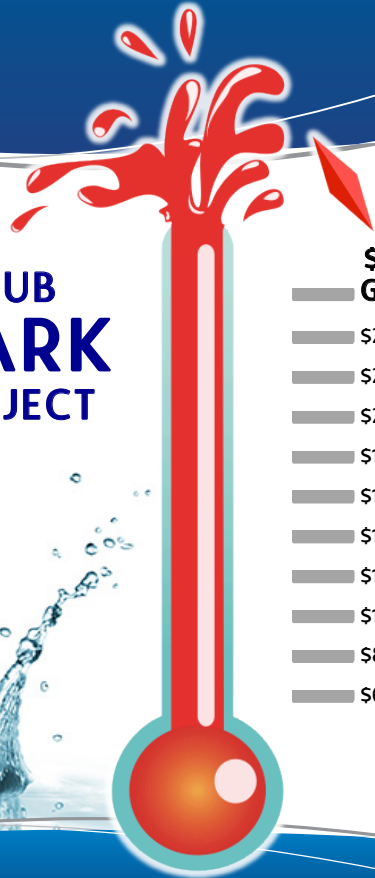

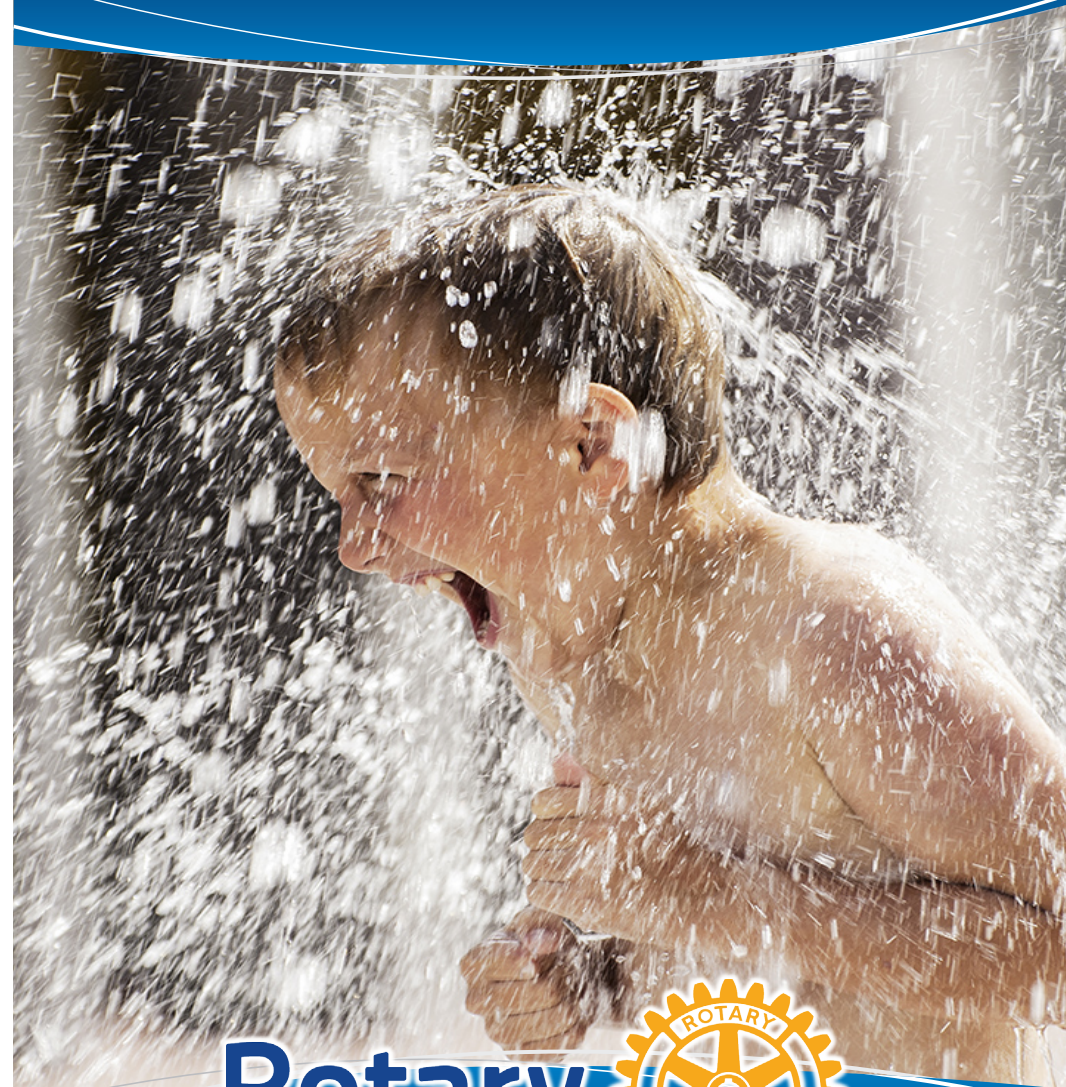

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# Rotary Splash Park

Terrace, B.C.

The Rotary Club of Terrace and the Rotary Club of Terrace Skeena Valley in partnership with the City of Terrace are planning to construct a Splash Park in downtown Terrace in 2016/2017.

The two Clubs have committed significant resources to this project and are looking for Corporate and individual donors to assist in making the plan a reality.

The City of Terrace has approved the splash park concept and set aside a space at George Little Park. The two Rotary Clubs have committed \$60,000.00 towards the purchase and construction of this park.

The total cost to complete this community project will be approximately \$250,000.00.

The project will be completed by one contractor specializing in the construction of this type of facility. Price will be based on a contract with the initial estimate from RECTEC Industries for a turn-key installation as follows:

Equipment:	\$89,120.00
Installation:	\$94,000.00
Taxes:	\$ 15,507.00
Delivery:	\$ 2,070.00
Contingency	\$ 50,000.00
<b>TOTAL COST:</b>	<b>\$250,897.00*</b>

*MOVED/SECONDED that Council approve the Rotary Club's donation of a splash park facility to be located in George Little Park; that the splash park project be engineered and designed with the City having final approval, and upon completion of the project, the Rotary Club will transfer ownership of the facility to the City for ongoing operation and maintenance. Carried Unanimously.*

# Background

2015

- City planning indicates a desire for a splash park in 2009.
- Small communities all over BC have splash parks with many being built through collaborative efforts with local rotary clubs.
- Now is the time to invest in a splash park for our community.

## Stakeholders

- City of Terrace providing land and on-going operational support.
- Rotary Club of Terrace and Rotary Club of Terrace Skeena Valley have committed \$60,000 towards the project.
- Verbal confirmation of support from several local businesses and industries.

## Construction Schedule

- Fundraising starting May 2015 until all required funds are obtained
- Projected 'Grand Opening' 2017
- Break Ground late 2016 / early 2017
- Construction from ground breaking to completion is expected to be 6-12 weeks

- A. EMERSON STREET**
  - market, park and play
- B. SPECIAL STREETSCAPE**
  - special paving, street trees, market kiosk frames
- C. ENHANCED CHILDREN'S PLAY/WATER AREA**
  - add children's garden/nature play
  - add new equipment
  - add spray park
  - contain edges with long benches
  - adjacent picnic tables
  - children's hill (1.8m high)summer slide, winter toboggan
- D. SKEENA WALK**
  - central walkway through park
  - references the meandering and braiding of the Skeena
  - lit at night
- E. SENIORS' FITNESS**
  - outdoor fitness centre
  - funded under a Provincial grant
- F. THE GREEN**
  - maintain open lawn
  - for performances, informal play
  - tree planting to define edges
- G. RENOVATED BANDSHELL (option B)**
  - minor renovation to improve appearance
  - ie remove back wall to open views for security
  - add small stage to Plaza
  - add seating steps
  - bandshell also doubles as a parks shelter
  - ie for a rainy Farmer's Market day
  - water and better electrical supply for events
- H. THE PERGOLA**
  - timber structure to define edge of plaza seating
  - possible cover
  - water/electrical for market food kiosk
  - lighting within
  - place for hanging banners or setting up Market Day
- I. CHILDREN'S OUTDOOR READING CIRCLE**
  - library garden
- J. SPIRIT SQUARE**
  - social heart
  - seating, gathering, events
  - sculpture as focus, public art opportunity
  - possible food ie, kiosk or cafe
  - farmers market could occupy on Saturdays
- K. PROPOSED CAFE**
  - screens service area for the library/art gallery
  - offers outdoor dining services for plaza
  - address on Park Avenue
