DELEGATIONS & GUESTS:

Suzy Annala-Macdonald and Tracy Spencer, Northwest Community College Social Service Worker Students – Social Work Week in Terrace Ms. Annala-Macdonald and Ms. Spencer introduced themselves and provided an overview of current social issues in the community such as a lack of affordable housing, the increasing rate of poverty, and substance abuse problems. Ms. Annala-Macdonald discussed the contributions that social service workers make to the community.

The students worked on a Community Development Project where a needs assessment of the social service work community in Terrace was conducted. The students would like to assist with the financial burden for social service work students by establishing a bursary fund. The Northwest Community College Social Service Worker Students requested that the City of Terrace provide a financial contribution to this fund.

Ms. Annala-Macdonald and Ms. Spencer introduced Dyani Simon, Vice President of the Northwest Branch of the BC Association of Social Workers. Social Work Week is from March 9 – March 16, 2014. This year's theme is Social Workers promoting Greater Social Equality. Northwest Community College will be holding an event on March 13 in support of the week. The Northwest Branch will be donating \$500 toward the bursary fund for the Northwest Community College Social Service Worker program and challenged the City of Terrace to meet or beat this donation.

Deputy Mayor Davies thanked Ms. Annala-Mcdonald and Ms. Spencer for their presentation, and advised that this matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (see Resolution No. 118).

Dan Nieckarz – Electronic Billboards Dan Nieckarz introduced himself and thanked Council for the opportunity to present. Mr. Nieckarz stated his concerns regarding the use of electronic billboards and signage for businesses in Terrace. Mr. Nieckarz cited studies that demonstrate that this type of signage may be a hazardous distraction for drivers.

Mr. Nieckarz requested that the City of Terrace develop and adopt a policy focusing on community beautification as well as prohibit the use of electronic billboards and signage for local businesses. Mr. Nieckarz also requested that the existing electronic signage for Boston Pizza in Terrace be removed.
