Carol Leclerc, member of the Minerals North 2013 Committee, thanked Council for the opportunity to present. Minerals North 2013 Conference will be held in Terrace on April 24 to 26. 2013.

They expect a minimum of 600 delegates to attend the conference. Ms. Leclerc thanked the City for agreeing to open the municipal campground on Ferry Island early to allow

delegates to camp there. The Minerals North 2013 Committee will continue to look for accommodations for the delegates, including billeting.

Ms. Leclerc anticipates that the economic spinoff from hosting the Minerals North 2013 Conference will be substantial. The Committee has obtained three \$1,500 sponsorships which will be used to purchase new chairs for the Terrace Sportsplex, and these chairs will be donated to the facility after the event. Donations will also be made to the Terrace Community Foundation in lieu of speakers' gifts.

The Minerals North 2013 Committee requested that the rental fee for the Terrace Sportsplex be waived for the Conference.

Mayor Pernarowski thanked Ms. Leclerc for her presentation, and advised that this matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (see Resolution No. 481).

Diana Penner, Greater Terrace Seniors' Advisory Committee – 2012 Report

Diana Penner, chair of the Greater Terrace Seniors' Advisory Committee (the Committee), described their mandate to advise Council regarding seniors' issues in the community. The Committee has been actively involved in the *Terrace* Transit Service Review process. Accessibility, public transportation, removal and safety are areas of concern for the Committee and Ms. Penner described their key priorities as safety, accessibility, affordability, and culture. She thanked Council for their continued efforts to improve accessibility for rail passengers.

Mayor Pernarowski thanked Ms. Penner for her presentation, and advised that this matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (see Resolution No. 482).

Diana Penner and Gordon Weary, Residents Advocating for a Safe and Inclusive Environment – Waste Management Ms. Penner introduced Northwest Community College Professor Gordon Weary. Mr. Weary has had a number of classes who have examined the Terrace landfill and studied waste management from the environmental and social perspectives.

Mr. Weary asked if the landfill could be modified to remain open longer. 61% of the waste at the Terrace landfill is compostable materials and paper and 5% is plastic and metal. He encouraged diverting these materials from the landfill as much as possible. He also asked if the landfill could be expanded at the existing site.

Mayor Pernarowski thanked Ms. Penner and Mr. Weary for their presentation, and advised that this matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (see Resolution No. 483).
