#### **DELEGATIONS & GUESTS:**

Farewell to Inspector Eric Stubbs and Former Fire Chief Peter Weeber Mayor Pernarowski welcomed Inspector Eric Stubbs and Peter Weeber. A synopsis of Inspector Stubbs' career in the Northwest was read by Mayor Pernarowski. He thanked the Inspector for his service to the City and wished him success in his future position as Superintendent in Prince George. He presented Inspector Stubbs with a parting gift. Inspector Stubbs thanked Council for their support and their honesty, and thanked the City's department heads and CAO Ron Poole for their teamwork.

Mayor Pernarowski read a brief biography of Peter Weeber's career at the City and his contributions to the City. Mayor Pernarowski wished him success in his future endeavors. Mr. Weeber was presented with a parting gift and a 10-year pin for his 10 years of service at the City of Terrace. Mr. Weeber addressed Council and thanked the CAO, City Staff and Council for their support during his time at the City of Terrace.

Devon Huning and Bay Generoso, Looping Systems 101 for Hearing Aid Users Mr. Bay Generoso is a local sign language interpreter who would like to see more signing services for the deaf community at public events in Terrace. Ms. Devon Huning is an audiologist located at the Terrace Health Unit. Hearing Loop Systems are designed to work with newer hearing aids to provide customized sound in specific locations. Ms. Huning estimated there are at least 500 hearing aid users in Terrace and surrounding communities. A loop system will allow hearing impaired people in the community to better hear what is being said at a play, meeting or other public event.

Ms. Huning asked Council to consider installing a loop system in one public meeting place such as Council Chambers. There are smaller, portable loop systems are also available.

Mayor Pernarowski thanked Ms. Huning and Mr. Generoso for their presentation, and advised that this matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (see Resolution No. 170).

Richard Chavez, Brinkman Forest Ltd. – Request for Letter of Support for Coast Tsimshian Resources LP Mr. Chavez thanked Council for the opportunity to present on their project, Climate Change Adaption Planning for Northwest Skeena Communities. Mr. Chavez gave an overview of their research project which is being led by Coast Tsimshian Resources LP and Brinkman Forest Ltd. The project will examine the potential impacts of different climate and landuse scenarios on the water, fisheries, forest and non-timber forest values and resources of the Skeena Watershed and the capacity of the communities to adapt to climate change.

They are searching for complimentary funding that would help with this large research project and intend to share the results of their research with the

City. Mr. Chavez would like a letter of support for their application for a technology and innovation award, which could possibly be a source of funding for their project.

Mayor Pernarowski thanked Mr. Chavez for his presentation, and advised that this matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (see Resolution No. 171).

Matt Beetle and Carolyn Doody, Community University Awareness Month Carolyn Doody and Matt Beetle, representing the Northwest regional campus of the University of Northern British Columbia (UNBC), presented information regarding Community University Awareness Month, which is a month-long campaign which will run from April 15 to May 15. Mr. Beetle, a graduate researcher at UNBC, provided Council with some history of UNBC.

Ms. Doody, the Northwest Regional Services Coordinator, feels that many people confuse UNBC with Northwest Community College. Ms. Doody listed all of the undergraduate and graduate programs as well as all the certificates and other offerings at the Northwest Regional Campus. She described some of the events being held to raise awareness of the campus in Terrace.

They requested that Council wear badges from April 15 to May 15 to raise awareness of the UNBC Northwest Regional Campus. They presented gifts to Mayor and Council.
