DELEGATIONS & GUESTS:

Graham Genge, Spectra Energy

– Spectra Energy Corp.

Presentation

Graham Genge, Community Coordinator for Spectra Energy, thanked Council for the opportunity to present. Mr. Genge introduced Spectra Energy and highlighted their work gathering, processing, and transporting natural gas in B.C for the last 55 years. Previously known as West Coast Energy, Spectra Energy generates approximately 60% of the natural gas in the Province. Spectra Energy's health and safety practices,

aboriginal and community relations, and communication processes were described. Spectra Energy also provides a number of different contract and employment opportunities for First Nations and local businesses.

Spectra Energy maintains a year round, 24 hour a day monitoring system on all of their gas lines. This system assists with incident management and precautionary measures. Regularly scheduled maintenance efforts monitor gas flow and operating status of all facilities.

In partnership with the BG Group, Spectra Energy is proposing a new natural gas transportation system project from northeast British Columbia. This will serve BG Group's potential liquefied natural gas (LNG) export facility in Prince Rupert. Outreach initiatives as well as local input forums have been provided to address local stakeholders regarding the proposed project. The proposed system would transport up to 4.2 billion cubic feet of natural gas per day. Spectra Energy is hoping to further expand into Asian and other international markets.

Mayor Pernarowski thanked Mr. Genge for his presentation, and advised that this matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (see Resolution No. 015).

Sarah Artis, Skeena Nass Centre for Innovation in Resource Economics – Request for Letter of Support Sarah Artis, a representative from the Skeena Nass Centre for Innovation in Resource Economics (SNCIRE), thanked Council for the opportunity to present. SNCIRE is a not for profit society serving Northwest BC. Members of SNCIRE aim to identify, develop, and promote opportunities to build a resilient and sustainable natural resource economy in the Skeena-Nass region.

SNCIRE will be hosting the Beyond Lumber 2013 – Art from Nature Conference & Art Show in the fall of 2013. This event highlights the value of Northwest B.C.'s forests and natural resources while raising the profile of Northwest B.C. artisans. SNCIRE plans to expand the Beyond Lumber 2013 event to include artists, crafts people, and innovators who work with local natural resources to participate in the workshops that will be offered.

SNCIRE requested a letter from the City of Terrace that offers tangible support for Beyond Lumber 2013 to submit for funding applications. Possible support initiatives may include the waiver of the rental fee of a city space or the use of City equipment.

Mayor Pernarowski thanked Ms. Artis for her presentation, and advised that this matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (see Resolution No. 016).

Kim Woodd, Terrace and District Arts Council – Request for Letter of Support Kim Woodd, a representative from the Terrace and District Arts Council (TDAC), thanked Council for the opportunity to present. TDAC is currently planning their 2013 Summer Arts Festival. Working in partnership with several local organizations as well as local artists and performers, TDAC provided over 50 events during this festival in 2012.

Ms. Woodd requested that the City of Terrace provide a letter of support as part of TDAC's Grant Application to the BC Arts Council's Project Assistance – Community Arts Festivals bursary. Building this festival assists in actively pursuing TDAC's mandates.

Mayor Pernarowski thanked Ms. Woodd for her presentation, and advised that this matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (see Resolution No. 017).

Barbara Tetz, Green Thumb Garden Society of Terrace, Inc. – 2012 Review Barbara Tetz, President of the Green Thumb Garden Society of Terrace, Inc., introduced Linda Wilson, Treasurer of the Society. Ms. Tetz introduced the Society, and explained that they were presenting to City Council as part of their lease agreement with the City.

Ms. Tetz provided an overview of the Society, outlining their mandates and objectives. Ms. Tetz reviewed the list of society members, and provided a review of the volunteer efforts and contributions for the previous year. Ms. Tetz provided a list of the donors to the Society of Terrace, highlighting the larger donations from several community members and organizations.

Ms. Wilson provided an overview of the outgoing costs for the Society, identifying a number of areas for potential sponsorship opportunities. Fundraising efforts as well as their totals were also provided.

Ms. Tetz discussed the Society's plans for 2013, including the potential construction of new signs, a donor wall, and a community root cellar. Public relations, advertising efforts, and continued fundraising were also identified as being a large focus for 2013.
