DELEGATIONS & GUESTS:

Sasa Loggin, Skeena Diversity – Introduction of Syrian Refugee Family to Terrace Ms. Loggin introduced Heather Hayes, who is part of the Group of Five who has sponsored a Syrian Refugee family to live in Terrace. Ms. Hayes introduced Amer and Rahma al Kadro and their children, Zeinab, aged 7, Youssef, aged 5, and Abd al Elah, aged 4. The al Kadro family arrived in Terrace from Syria five weeks ago. Mayor Leclerc welcomed the family to Terrace.

Ms. al Kadro thanked Terrace and thanked Canada for the welcome to Canada and to the community. Ms. Loggin thanked everyone in Terrace for the support and sponsorship for the families.

Ms. Loggin introduced Darryl Wightman, who is from the other Group of Five, who is sponsoring a second family to come to Terrace. There are also two local churches sponsoring two additional families, one from Syria, and one from Irag.

Ms. Loggin requested that the City provide bus passes and leisure services discounts to the refugee families staying in Terrace.

Mayor Leclerc thanked Ms. Loggin for her presentation and welcomed the family to Terrace. She also advised that the matter would be further dealt with under Correspondence. (See Resolution No. 305).

Arlene Ridler – Request to Keep Sea-Can on the Property Ms. Ridler addressed Council in response correspondence she has received from the City regarding the sea-can, referred to as a shipping container in our Bylaw on her property. Currently, as shipping containers are not allowed on Residential or Agricultural zoned properties. She requested that Council allow her to keep the sea-can on her property so she has a storage location to keep tools and personal items during the renovation of their home. Ms. Ridler indicated that her renovations have taken longer than she intended and she would like to complete her renovation and landscaping projects. Ms. Ridler has approximately 22 acres on Graham Avenue that borders the City of Terrace water treatment facility on one side. The northern portion of the property is zoned R2 – semi-detached residential and the southern portion is zoned AR1 -Agricultural. The shipping container has been on the property for approximately 4 years. She experiences trespassers on her property on a regular basis and has experienced theft of items from the property. The sea-can on the property provides a safe, lockable structure for her. After the home is renovated she would like to move the sea-can further back on the property, landscape around it to make it more visually appealing, and then to use it as a secure location for her supplies for her horses on the property. The City Planner explained that if Ms. Ridler wishes to keep the sea-can on her property the process is to apply for a Temporary Use Permit.

Mayor Leclerc thanked Ms. Ridler for her presentation and advised that the matter would be further dealt with under Correspondence. (See Resolution No. 306).
