#### **DELEGATIONS & GUESTS:**

Sasa Loggin, Skeena Diversity Society – Skeena Diversity Society Update Mayor Leclerc welcomed Sasa Loggin of the Skeena Diversity Society to the Council Meeting.

Ms. Loggin provided an update on Skeena Diversity Society. Skeena Diversity Society has added two new services for newcomers which include Language Support and Parent-Child Programs. Some of Skeena Diversity Society's main programs are English language improvement, immigration support, employment and education, workplace culture, domestic issues and legal matters, and community engagement.

Some of the weekly programs offered by Skeena Diversity Society are international cooking, English conversation and one-on-one sessions, and parent-child drop-ins. This year the amount of different groups using Skeena Diversity Society's space has increased.

Some of the community events that the Skeena Diversity Society has been involved with are the Northwest Spirit of Wellness Expo, the Community Resource Fair, the Girl Guides performance, and Mexico Independence Day at Northwest Community College.

About one year ago three Syrian refugee families joined our community. They are all doing very well. One of the families recently moved to Ottawa. These families have had English lessons, have become locally employed, have found homes in Terrace, and have had ongoing community support. All three of these families were sponsored through private sponsorships that were very successful.

International cooking has been offered for three years now. This program has brought the community together. The Skeena Diversity Society has created a 2018 international cooking calendar and all proceeds from the sales of these calendars will go to buying ingredients required for the international cooking program. Ms. Loggin presented Mayor Leclerc with a calendar.

There will be a Community Resource Fair in March 2018 and the Northwest Spirit of Wellness Expo will be held again in April 2018.

Mayor Leclerc thanked Ms. Loggin for her update and presentation and advised that the matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (See Resolution No. 446).

Deklan Corstanje, Regional District of Kitimat-Stikine – Request for Letter of Support for Rural Dividend Application Mayor Leclerc welcomed Deklan Corstanje of the Regional District of Kitimat-Stikine to the Council Meeting.

Mr. Corstanje is part of a consortium consisting of the Economic Development Commission of the Regional District of Kitimat-Stikine, Nisga'a Lisims Government, Kermodei Tourism, and Kitimat Tourism who are looking to do a regional tourism marketing initiative.

Grant applications have been submitted to Destination BC, Northern Development, and the BC Rural Dividend.

The project will be looking at doing research, planning, branding, a shared landing page, and actionable tactics to increase visitors and visitor spending in the region.

The consortium is strategically made up of a group that can bring different components of northern tourism to the table. Together this group will be able to offer a vast variety of activities that tourists generally engage in while in the North.

The consortium is looking for support from stakeholders in the region. Mr. Corstanje requested a letter of support from the City for the initiative. The letter will be included in their application to the BC Rural Dividend.

As much of the campaign's content will be online, there are a number of different ways to track key performance indicators. Visitors, page views, industry benchmarks on engagement, and increased followers are a few of the many components that are able to be tracked.

The focus for this consortium is to start small with the current group and eventually take larger steps in the future based on the success of the campaign. If the grant application is accepted, they could receive up to \$250,000. The grant application submitted through Destination BC could potentially provide an additional \$250,000 if accepted.

Mayor Leclerc thanked Mr. Corstanje for his presentation and advised that the matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (See Resolution No. 447).
