MINUTES OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING HELD IN THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL CHAMBERS ON MONDAY, MAY 14, 2018 AT 7:30 P.M.

Deputy Mayor J. Cordeiro presided. Councillors present were L. Christiansen, B. Downie, M. Prevost, and S. Tyers. Mayor C. Leclerc and Councillor S. Bujtas were absent. Also in attendance were T. Irwin, City Planner, A. Thompson, Clerk, and A. Poole, Executive Assistant.

MOVE TO IN-CAMERA SPECIAL COUNCIL:

Meeting Called to Order at 7:15 p.m. – Move to In-Camera Special Council

Deputy Mayor Cordeiro advised that Council agendas and minutes are available for viewing on the City's home page at www.terrace.ca, Council meetings are webcast on the City's website, and the past minutes have been archived.

DELEGATIONS & GUESTS:

Sheila Gruenwald, Reclaim Personal Development Inc. – National Indian Brotherhood (NIB) Funding Update Ms. Gruenwald was absent from the Council meeting. This item was struck from the Agenda.

Mary Ann Lawrence, R.E.M. Lee Theatre Alive (1988) Society – Request for a Resolution of Support for a Grant Application to Canada Cultural Spaces Fund Deputy Mayor Cordeiro welcomed Mary Ann Lawrence of the R.E.M. Lee Theatre Alive (1988) Society to the Council meeting.

The R.E.M. Lee Theatre Alive (1988) Society requested a resolution of support for their \$150,000 application to the Canada Cultural Spaces Fund.

The R.E.M. Lee Theatre is in the midst of a large scale funding campaign to upgrade the theatre. To date they have raised \$269,100. This amount is comprised of:

- > \$100,000 BC Rural Dividend grant;
- > \$35,000 Northern Development Initiative Trust Grants;
- > \$10,000 Terrace Community Foundation;
- > \$16,750 Individual Community Seat Sale Contributions;
- \$20,000 Rio Tinto Alcan;
- > \$4,850 artsVest BC;
- \$32,500 local business sponsors; and
- > \$50,000 Theatre Alive.

The R.E.M. Lee Theatre Alive (1988) Society has started sound equipment upgrades and performance lighting upgrades. They hope to do new seat and carpet installations in 2019.

The R.E.M. Lee Theatre is an asset to the community. In 2017, 67% of the performances were community presentations and of those 91% were put on by local non-profit organizations.

Deputy Mayor Cordeiro thanked Ms. Lawrence for her presentation and advised that the matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (See Resolution No. 177).

Jennifer Osmar, AltaGas Ltd., and Kelly Swain, Northwest Community College – Request for Letter of Support Deputy Mayor Cordeiro welcomed Jennifer Osmar of AltaGas Ltd. and Kelly Swain of Northwest Community College (NWCC) to the Council meeting.

NWCC, in partnership with AltaGas, is proposing to purchase a new mobile lab and classroom this year. The mobile lab and classroom will allow NWCC to deliver a hands-on program for Gas Process Operators. The mobile lab and classroom will be equipped with the appropriate infrastructure.

NWCC has found it difficult for some students to travel to the college for training as this region is quite broad. The mobile lab and classroom will allow for program delivery throughout the region. The proposed mobile lab and classroom will be approximately 1,000 square feet. The unit will also help to meet training needs in business programs, health care assistant programs, early childhood educator programs, and other regional programs.

AltaGas approached NWCC regarding the creation of a customized program as the propane export industry is new in BC. An online program will be offered with the ability to deliver hands-on training as well.

NWCC has applied for funding through Western Diversification. NWCC and AltaGas are both contributing to the project. They have support from various industries, school districts, local governments, and indigenous communities.

Initially, training will take place in Prince Rupert with a second location in Terrace. NWCC will facilitate the training. On-site exposure at one of the AltaGas facilities will be provided during the training program. Students who successfully complete the training program can apply to be considered for full-time employment at the Ridley Island Propane Export Terminal (RIPET) facility.

NWCC already utilizes 3 mobile units. These mobile units are specialized for trades, safety, and heavy equipment operators and are being used consistently.

Within the next 3 years the new mobile lab and classroom is projected to train approximately 100 students.

NWCC and AltaGas requested a letter of support to accompany their application to Western Diversification to purchase the mobile lab and classroom.

Deputy Mayor Cordeiro thanked Ms. Osmar and Ms. Swain for their presentation and advised that the matter would be further dealt with under the "Correspondence" portion of this meeting's Agenda (See Resolution No. 178).

1. DEVELOPMENT PERMIT NO. 01-2018 – SKEENA SAWMILLS (5402 HIGHWAY 16 WEST)

It was recommended that Development Permit No. 01-2018 be issued to ROC Holdings Ltd. for the property legally described as Lot A, District Lot 1745, Range 5, Coast District, Plan PRP14269 Except Plan BCP43221 (5402 Highway 16 West) to permit the conversion of an existing building to a pellet plant and complete the site enhancements to enable this development.

2. OFFSITE WORKS AND SERVICES AS REQUIRED BY SUBDIVISION AND DEVELOPMENT BYLAW NO. 1591-1997 IN CONJUNCTION WITH ISSUANCE OF DEVELOPMENT PERMIT NO. 01-2018

It was recommended that Off-site Works and Services, as itemized below, for Frank Street and Green Street be completed by the developer, at their cost, to facilitate the development of a pellet plant and associated accessory structures on 5402 Highway 16:

- 1. Construction of an asphalt surface driveway within the undeveloped Green Street right-of-way at a minimum 9 metre width as well as an asphalt driveway access to the subject property. The driveway access shall be constructed to a minimum 7 metre width.
- 2. Abandoning the existing City owned 200mm water main on the subject site, removal of existing hydrant and installation of a new fire hydrant on the west side of Frank Street dedication at the Highway 16 intersection.
- 3. These off-site improvements are a requirement as per Subdivision and Development Bylaw 1591-1997 in conjunction with issuance of Development Permit 01-2018.

3. DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT NO. 05-2018 - MILLAR (4712 GRAHAM AVENUE)

It was recommended that the City issue Development Variance Permit No. 05-2018 for the property located at 4712 Graham Avenue (Lot 6, District Lot 360, Range 5, Coast District, Plan 7216), including the following variance:

➤ To vary Section 11.1.3.3.a of Zoning Bylaw 2069-2014 and amendments thereto to allow the front (south) parcel line set back in the R1 – Single Detached Residential Zone to be decreased from 7.5 metres to 7.3 metres.

4. DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT NO. 06-2018 – WYATT (2504 PEAR STREET)

It was recommended that the City issue Development Variance Permit No. 06-2018 for the property located at 2504 Pear Street (Lot 5 Except: Part Subdivided by Plan BCP21019, District Lot 360, Range 5, Coast District, Plan 7216), including the following variance:

➤ To vary Section 11.3.3.10 of Zoning Bylaw 2069-2014 and amendments thereto to allow the maximum footprint of an accessory building in the R2 – Semi-Detached Residential Zone to be increased from 55 m² to 62.4 m².

5. DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT NO. 07-2018 – HEIGHINGTON (5110 MCCONNELL AVENUE)

It was recommended that the City issue Development Variance Permit No. 07-2018 for the property located at 5110 McConnell Avenue (Lot B, District Lot 980, Range 5, Coast District, Plan 9713 Except Plan PRP14907), including the following variance:

➤ To vary Section 11.1.3.10 of Zoning Bylaw 2069-2014 and amendments thereto to allow the maximum footprint of an accessory building in the R1 – Single Detached Residential Zone to be increased from 55 m² to 111.5 m².

6. DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT NO. 08-2018 - PETERS (2619 BRAUN STREET)

It was recommended that the City issue Development Variance Permit No. 08-2018 for the property located at 2619 Braun Street (Lot A, District Lot 615, Range 5, Coast District, Plan EPP42996), including the following variance:

➤ To vary Section 11.3.3.3.a of Zoning Bylaw 2069-2014 and amendments thereto to allow the front parcel line set back in the R2 - Semi-Detached Residential Zone to be decreased from 7.5 metres to 6.0 metres from the north parcel line.
