An art installation made by the students of Suwilaawks School, installed along Howe Creek Trail in honour of National Day of Truth and Reconciliation has been destroyed by vandals.

In the strongest possible terms, the City of Terrace condemns this action. A day that is meant to learn from our mistakes, this is a step backwards and must be called out.

Community members have rallied to collect replacement wooden heart panels, paint, and other supplies. A booth will be set up at the Skeena Valley Farmers Market the morning of October 1st and people are invited to paint hearts and write messages of healing, love, and support. These will be rehung along the Howe Creek Trail.
