Park	efforts to pilot the Skateboard Park project.

Ms. Critchley stressed that this is a youth driven project that is still in the planning stages. She went on to address some of the concerns expressed by the community over the proposed Skateboard Park as follows:

- there are examples of success stories where the youth took ownership of a project, and the youth felt a greater sense of responsibility and respect, with more eagerness to follow the guidelines laid out, since they were instrumental in setting the guidelines at the onset:
- if facilities such as the proposed Skateboard Park are not available to the youth, that vandalism could be a problem throughout the community;
- formal supervision of tennis courts and parks have never been a consideration of the community, and to implement supervision of the Skateboard Park would be sending the message that the youth using the facility require "baby-sitting".

Numerous youth responded in kind, stressing that there is little likelihood of excessive noise or vandalism since the proposed Skateboard Park would be located next to the R.C.M.P. station.

Mayor Talstra thanked Mr. Durando, Ms. Critchley and the youth for their comments, and advised that this project is in the early planning stages, with meetings between the youth and Councillor McDaniel ongoing.

Mr. Joseph Durando of 4813 Lazelle Avenue requested that the City of Terrace investigate the flooding problem that has been evident over the years at 4813 Lazelle Avenue, and install a storm sewer.

Mayor Talstra thanked Mr. DeJong for his presentation, and further explained the rationale behind Council's decision to standardize its vehicle fleet. Councillor G. Hull, Chairman of the Public Works Committee, added that their decision does not necessarily preclude the City from putting vehicle purchases out to tender.
