



TERRACE COMMUNITY FOREST PRESENTS \$50,000 IN GRANT FUNDING TO COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS

On Wednesday, February 12, 2020, Terrace Community Forest presented \$50,000 in grants on behalf of the City of Terrace to eight local organizations seeking funding for recreational projects to benefit the community. Grants ranged from \$2,500 to the Mount Remo Backcountry Society to improve road access to backcountry areas, to \$10,000 for the Terrace Curling Club to upgrade their ice plant. At the presentation, held during a noon-hour Committee of the Whole meeting at City Hall, the grantees explained their projects to Council and thanked Terrace Community Forest and the City for their support.

Terrace Community Forest (TCF) is a private company owned by the City of Terrace and managed by an appointed Board of Directors, meaning the City is not involved in day-to-day operations. TCF generates revenue through a forest license to harvest trees within three operating areas: Shames/Amesbury including My Mountain Co-Op; Kitimat Valley and Nordic ski trails; and Deep/Spring Creek including the LaLa Valley and Steinhoe trail systems. TCF has an allowable annual cut of approximately 30,000 cubic metres, which equates to about 600 loaded logging trucks. To date, the City has received \$1.2 million in revenue from TCF since it received forest tenure in 2007.

With this year's numbers included, TCF has granted out approximately \$500,000 on behalf of the City of Terrace to community groups that provide recreational opportunities in the community.
