



Temporary Expanded Service Areas (TESAs) provide short-term outdoor spaces for Liquor and Food Primary and Manufacturer licensees to serve their customers.

Under the <u>Liquor and Cannabis Regulation</u>
<u>Branch (LCRB) Policy 20–26</u>, all LCRB
application fees associated with TESAs have
been waived to help support businesses meet
physical distancing guidelines.

## WHAT DO YOU MEAN BY "TEMPORARY"?

The expiry for TESAs authorized or applied for under this policy is currently October 31, 2021.


This may be extended as per LCRB direction.

## **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

Interested businesses are to submit a basic site plan to the City of Terrace prior to installation that includes the proposed TESA:

- Dimensions
- Distance to property lines
- Maximum occupancy
- Perimeter barrier material
- Safety details (i.e. signage, lighting)
- Any additional design details

Following municipal approval of the site plan, a municipal support letter for the TESA can be issued. Staff will strive to efficiently provide approval of the proposed TESA.



## CAN I MAKE IT PERMANENT?

Construction of permanent patios are considered a structural change and are required to go through the regular LCRB and municipal approval processes.
